Our Lady of Fatima

From the Magnificat magazine:

On July of 1917, after the three children of Fatima saw a vision of hell, the Virgin Mary told them: "You have seen hell, where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate heart...I shall come to ask for the Communion of Reparation on the first Saturdays."

When Mary appeared to Lucia in 1925, she asked for a devotion to be practiced over five consecutive first Saturdays— a number corresponding to five particular offenses: those against her Immaculate Conception, perpetual virginity, and motherhood, both of God and man, and attempts to make Mary's children turn against her and insults to her in her images.

Our Blessed Mother told Lucia, "Announce in my name that I promise to assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who on the first Saturday for five consecutive months go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the rosary, with intention of making reparation."

Beloved Lord, inspire in our hearts the same fervor which you feel for your Mother and help us to make her known, loved, and honored.

A Sanctuary for Healing




