FOR WHAT DOES "OCIA" STAND?

You may be familiar with

"RCIA"- Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults- the process in which adults learn about and enter the Catholic Church. The word "rite" is not the correct term for those preparing to enter the Church, as the process is actually an "order". An "order" denotes a particular status within the Church, while a "rite" is the liturgical event that initiates a person into an "order". Those who go through the Rite of Welcome enter the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults - OCIA.

If you know someone interested in learning more about the Faith, invite that person to the Inquiry sessions that are held in the Parish Library, 9:45-11:15am, Sunday mornings.



Though a simple act, registration is a sign of one's commitment and responsibility to the parish and allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your **Active membership** and is **essential for participation** in parish programs and sacraments.

What is an **Active Membership?** Three points determine active membership:

- Registration in the parish for a sufficient period of time and use of the envelope system in support of the parish;
- Faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days;
- Volunteer and participate in Parish activities with time, talent, and treasure as means permit.

Please note: The Facilities and Services of Good Shepherd Church are available to active members.

<u>Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized:</u> Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

<u>Bulletin Deadline</u>: Requests must be received 10 days <u>prior</u> to the weekend the announcement is to be published. E-mail your request to: **gsbulletinedit@gmail.com**.

<u>Special Needs:</u> Handicapped accessible doors are located on the left side of the Gathering Area.

A Sanctuary for Healing






