


WHAT IS THE 11th/12th GRADE CLASS LIKE?

Youth who participate in this class move into the format used for Adult Formation – That is the participants choose what topics and activities they want to do. 


PLANNING NEXT YEAR'S CLASSES



GOOD SHEPHERD PARISH MINISTRIES

We are called to conform ourselves to Christ.

Christ is the Good Shepherd, who gathers us to Himself.

We are His flock. We hear His voice.

To follow Him, we must also be good shepherds, leading each other to grow in holiness on a path to eternal life.

We are the Body of Christ. God has given each of us special gifts and talents, to be used to heal, rebuild and strengthen the Body of Christ.



LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

<u>Sacristans</u> are responsible for setting the Altar and see to the care of the various candles located in the Sanctuary. They are also responsible for ensuring everything is in order for the celebration of Mass, allowing the Celebrant to concentrate solely on the liturgy.

<u>Hospitality Ministers</u> greet you at the door and assist you if needed to find a seat. They ensure that all lay ministers are present: Altar Servers, Lector, Ushers and bid you farewell after Mass with a bulletin.

Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist (EXOs) assist with the Celebration by distributing the Precious Body and Blood of Christ to His people.

<u>Lectors</u> nourish the Faith of the community by proclaiming the Word of God in an audible and intelligible manner to the community.

<u>Altar Servers</u> assist the Celebrant with the celebration of Liturgies by performing various liturgical tasks that contribute to the worship setting.

<u>Sick and Homebound Ministry</u>: A Corporal and Spiritual Act of Mercy; a ministry of inconvenience yet one that gives from the heart, with "miraculous rewards" as you bring the Eucharist to others. You get to see the joy of a person's face, a family growing closer together in prayer and finding the love for one another in the love Christ has for the one who is sick.

MUSIC MINISTRY

<u>Adult Choir</u> members are volunteers who proclaim glad tidings through song at the weekend liturgies, Holy Days of Obligation and special services such as funerals and other celebrations.

CATECHETICAL MINISTRIES

<u>Catechists</u> We help the parish fulfill its mission to preach the Word through the ministry of Catechesis, i.e. echoing the Word of God in the faith formation classes for parishioners of pre-school age through adulthood. Catechists for all age groups are needed.

Youth Group (Middle and High School) Fosters a personal relationship between teenagers and Jesus and his Church by helping them grow in their Catholic faith through worship, studying the Faith, social events and service projects. Both High School and Middle School youth enjoy a safe environment in the company of adults who practice the Faith and are willing to share it.

O.C.I.A. The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly known as RCIA) is a process offered to adults seeking information about the Catholic Church with a view to joining the Church. The OCIA Team is composed of parishioners who teach and share the Catholic faith with OCIA participants. OCIA also provides sponsors for those seeking to become Catholic Christians. Sponsors walk with candidates sharing their faith experiences and knowledge of the Catholic Church. Sponsors must be at least 18 years of age and in full communion with the Catholic Church.

SERVICE MINISTRIES

<u>Parish Pastoral Council</u> is a group of parishioners who give their time by being elected for a period of 3 years. The Council meets once a month. Elections are held during Advent of the election year. The purpose of the Council is to help the Pastor envision present and future plans for the Parish, to make suggestions/recommendations that he will take under advisement, to facilitate communication between the Pastor and parishioners. They also support the financial, social, ministerial and spiritual aspects of the Parish Community.

<u>Pro-Life Ministry</u> is dedicated to defend life from natural conception through natural death. Offers classes, retreats, and informational sessions pertaining to promoting a culture of life.

<u>Widow's Watch:</u> A support group for widows to give comfort to one another, fellowship and spiritual support. Meets the first Friday of the month at 11:00am in Room 4 of the church, followed by celebrating Mass together and then lunch. "His wings were ready but my heart was not."

<u>Women of Charity (WOC):</u> an Outreach Group for women of all ages in our parish. The WOC visits local nursing homes and the women's homeless shelter downtown. They also host fundraisers with all of the proceeds benefitting needy children and families. They send hundreds of greeting cards to the sick and homebound each year and help assist other ministries in our parish, such as the Knights of Columbus. We meet the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00pm.

<u>Holy Stitchers</u>: a group who meet every Thursday morning at 10:00 am. The group comes together to sew items and socialize, and find creative ways to support the parish and community. If you would like to learn to sew, come join us.

<u>Welcoming Ministry</u>: Four times a year, the parish hosts a welcoming dinner at the Rectory for new members of our faith community. Volunteers help prepare and host the dinner. **Contact Ministry Coordinator for more information.

<u>Parish Social Life Committee</u>: is a pool of disciples that assist with various Parish-wide functions. Activities include cooking, setting up, cleaning up, and other duties as needed. The Committee is responsible for organizing and running Fall Festival/Trick or Trunk, Lenten Suppers, Catechetical Sunday Potluck, First Communion, Confirmation, and OCIA Receptions, Marriage & Funeral Receptions, and Good Shepherd Sunday. This is an excellent opportunity to use those hidden unused talents and much needed time that our Lord has graciously bestowed upon us. You are not obligated to assist with all activities. ** Contact the Chairperson for more information. **

<u>Bulletin Inserters</u> assist the office staff by "inserting" the weekly bulletin with informative inserts. They will be called upon to help every few months for one hour on a Friday. They may also help with large mailings, etc. **Contact the Office for more information.

Garden Committee helps keep the parish grounds looking neat and beautiful. **Contact the Office for more information.

CATHOLIC LAY SOCIETIES

<u>Knights of Columbus #8857</u>: God, family, community—these are the priorities of the Knights of Columbus. The Knights of Columbus is a fraternal order in which the Knights and their families act on these priorities continually throughout the year to make a difference in our Church, community and world. The Knights meet on the first Thursday of each month.

<u>Catholic Daughters of America</u>: A national organization of Catholic women in the Americas. The Catholic Daughters of America donate to charities, administer scholarship programs and strive "to be helping hands where there is pain, poverty, sorrow or sickness." They embrace the principle of faith working through love in the promotion of justice, equality and the advancement of human rights and human dignity for all.

<u>Legion of Mary</u> The Legion of Mary is an Association of Catholics with the sanction of the Catholic Church and under the powerful leadership of Mary Immaculate, Mediatrix of Graces, formed to assist the Church's struggle to promote good over evil. Through prayer, especially the Most Holy Rosary, and apostolic works, it promotes personal holiness and the desire to bring people to Christ through His Mother. The Legion is open for both men and women who want to strengthen their devotion to Mary and work to bring others to Jesus through her Motherhood of God and the power of the Holy Spirit.

The local unit of the Legion of Mary is a *praesidium*, named after the Latin word for a local military detachment. Here at Good Shepherd, we are the Mother of the Eucharist Praesidium. We meet Monday evenings at 6:00pm.




